What is JUSP?



JUSP is a managed service that collects COUNTER usage reports on behalf of libraries



Started in 2010 as the Journal Usage Statistics Portal with a higher education and Jisc agreement focus



View usage statistics at the journal, book, database, and platform level



Reduces the burden of data collection and collation so that libraries can focus on reporting and analysis

- Using SUSHI
- Quality assurance: inspect reports and resolve issues

Monthly data collection

Reports and visualisations

- ·Libraries access via an online portal
- Email delivery
- Harvest into library systems via SUSHI

- Data restatement
- Liaising over data queries and issues
- Filling gaps
- Platform changes

Ongoing maintenance



What does it help libraries do?



Regular reporting

Gather stats for regular reporting (both internal and external)



Evaluation

Assists in understanding e-resource usage Packages or individual purchases



Informing decisions

Helps inform collection management decisions Renewals, substitutions, cancellations, purchases Strategy



Value and impact

Promotes the libraries

Makes effective use of staff time



What's not in JUSP

- Cost information
- Non-COUNTER compliant stats
- Subject or curriculum information
- •Who is viewing the content




JUSP "customised" standard view – same stats, different layout





Usage by publication year









